

17 *James T. Baker House* *1444 Maine Street*



An Italianate house on a grand scale, the Baker residence was designed by William B. Haworth and built for a prominent wholesale

grocer in 1867-68. The extensive brick walks around the house and from the house to Maine Street are original. The house is notable for the rope molding surrounding the window frames, large-scale double bracketing at the roofline, and graceful porches. It is a significant building in the East End Historic District and demonstrates an important adaptive use, serving as the headquarters of the Quincy Board of Education since 1966.
