

16 *Henry E. Dickhut House* *1401 Maine Street*

This heavily decorated stone and brick residence, built in 1876, combines Italianate, Second Empire, Queen Anne, and Eastlake influences. The original owner was a lumber merchant who later managed the Gem City Saw Mill. Prominent features are the Queen Anne porch (with its balustrades, pediment, and ornamental capitals), stone-hooded windows, and leaded and beveled window glass. Bottle glass is used in the bay windows on the east side.
