

Wheat/Richardson house 835 Cedar

The Wheat/Richardson house was built in the Queen Anne style in 1902 for Almeron Wheat Jr., a Quincy attorney. The home has been the residence of Sherry and Lloyd Holtman since July 1985.

The house's picturesque quality, roof forms and its large columned wrap-around front porch, often known as the "great American porch," exemplify its Queen Anne style.

The house features a first-floor suite arrangement of a stair hall, parlor, a back parlor or library and dining room. The parlor and stair hall contain butternut woodwork. Fireplace mantels are walnut. The library is separated by large sliding doors.
