Anna D. McFadon Property

vernacular 2/3 double pile house

architect unknown

--Anna D. McFadon was the daughter of John & Anna Catherine (Dean) McFadon. John owned this property as early as 1846.

--John was an early Quincyan who was already wealthy when he came here

--He married Anna Dean on February 13, 1842 who was 25 years younger than him. He died on March 22, 1864 & she in 1901.

--His daughter, Anna, took over the property when he died. I believe that the house was built in 1875 as a rental house.

--She married William A. Richardson, Jr. on January 3, 1881 who early on was involved with the railroad construction & engineering. After this he studied law with Hon. O. H. Browning. He was admitted to the bar in 1876. He eventually was elected city attorney, was a member of the Illinois legislature, and was a United States commissioner.

--Anna D. McFadon Richardson owned the property until 1921
