St. Cecilia, Virgin and Martyr

Feast Day, November 22

She was a Roman by birth and was forced to marry Valerian, a pagan. She converted to him and his brother, Tiburtius, to the faith. Although married, she preserved her virginity. She died in 230. St. Cecilia sang to God in her heart on this account she has been chosen as the patroness of musicians.

St. Catherine, Virgin and Martyr

Feast Day, November 25

She was educated in the sciences, converted many learned men who assembled to convince her to sacrifice to their pagan idols. She was beheaded about the year 310, during the reign of Maximian.

St. Agatha, Virgin and Martyr

Feast Day, February 5.

An illustrious Sicilian Virgin, she was martyred at Catania in the year 251 for refusing the solicitation of a Roman Senator.

**Located at the very top of the
Sacred Hearts altar.**

St. Boniface, Bishop, Martyr,

Feast Day, June 5th.

St. Boniface was born in England at the end of the 7th Century. He entered the Order of St. Benedict. He merited the title of Apostle of Germany. The Church of Utrecht in Frisia was under his care. The Frisians massacred him and 30 of his monks in June, 755. His body is buried in the celebrated Abby of Fulda which he founded.

St. Stephen, First Martyr.

Feast Day, December 26th.

St. Stephen was known as the First Deacon and the First Martyr. You can learn more about how he was inspired by the Holy Spirit by reading "the Acts", Ch. 6, vs 8-10 and Ch. 7, vs 54-59.

St. Aloysius Gonzaga, Confessor.

Feast Day June 21st.

He was born at the Castle of Castiglione in Italy. At a very young age he entered the Jesuit Order, giving up his rights to title and land of Gonzagas. He was respected for his great love for purity. He was helping the sick in Rome when he caught the disease and died at the young age of 23. Pope Benedict XIII made him patron of Youths.
