This early 19th century frame house reflects the charm, beauty and excellent construction during that period. Several styles appear in this house; Greek Revival returns, early Italianate style cornice and bracketing with simple but elegant dentil trim which surround the facade. The low floor length windows on the first floor are a notable feature also. During one period of time a matching porch, just south of the entry porch, was added, but later removed.

The interior of this house appears to have much the same look as the day it was built, but has been changed to a degree with a very workable modern kitchen, a half bath downstairs and a lovely modern bath upstairs.

This year a screened in porch with surrounding deck has been added providing an added comfort without taking away from the architectural beauty and unique character of the house. Mr. and Mrs. Roderick P. Miller, Jr. recently took possession of the house.
