Vestibule or otherwise known as a double entry, the wood work is butternut and has beveled glass in the doors and front entry doors fold back into the wall.

Raised panel and applied molding throughout the entry way and foyer. Floor in foyer is quarter sawn white oak. Butternut wood in the foyer and has dentil molding and keeping in character with the outside accent of dentil molding.

Pallor has butternut wainscoting. Fireplace in pallor is the mantle from John Wood Octagonal House. The marble mantel is white Italianate correra marble. Dentil molding throughout the downstairs. In the front pallor the glass is clear and stained leaded glass with ribbons and fleur-de-lis motif with jewels. This theme is carried out throughout the downstairs windows. Original crown molding in the pallor. Paneled beaded board under the windows.

Living room

Significant piece - Empire sofa was given to the Women's City Club by Mr. Oakley's Godmother it dates back to 1840's and is maghony wood.

Fireplace has the original tile with dentil molding and beading and handcraved motif

Similar clear and stained leaded glass with jewels

Bay windows

On the wall the scones are original

Doors to dining room are pocket doors and doors to entry foyer

Floors have mitered corners in all the downstairs rooms except the foyer

Dining room

Bay windows with similar glass motif

Throughout the dining room there is flat paneled wainscoting and applied molding and doors are raised panels with applied molding

Exit dining room by two doors with leaded glass

The room was added on approximately ten years (1900's) after the house was built. It was called the billiard room and the present owners use it as a family room. The wood in this room is stained dark cypress with original finish. It has wainscoting with a plate rail all around the room and the dentil molding as well as the clear and stained glass window.

Light fixtures in pallor and living room are original.
