



Quincy

Located on the Mississippi River, Quincy is about 100 miles from Springfield, Illinois and St. Louis, Missouri. Chicago is about a 300 mile trip.

In 1821 Quincy's founder John Wood, purchased 160 acres of land, the only site within 100 miles where the bluff reached the Mississippi River and also had a natural harbor. Quincy was incorporated as a town in 1834 and named for John Quincy Adams, 6th President of the United States.

Quincy is a pretty town with wide, tree-lined streets and magnificent architecture. Named an All-American City in 1962 and 1984, Quincy is a modern, progressive industrial city in the heart of a fertile agricultural area.

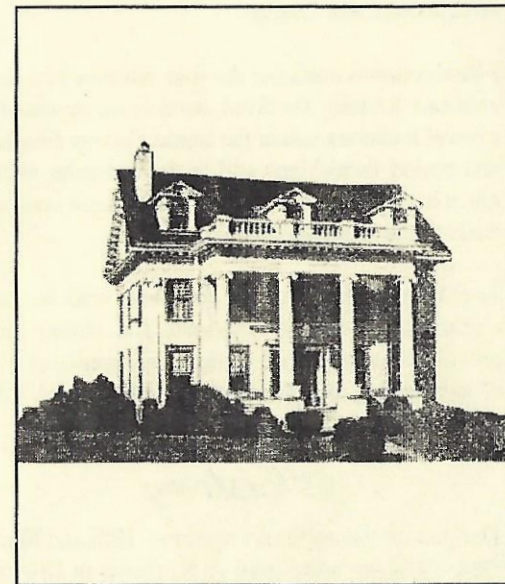
Quincy also boasts opportunities for social and cultural satisfaction with its many clubs, museums, music and theaters.
