



The Frank and Dr. Hildegard Sinnock House, 1934
2315 York Street
Georgian Revival Style

Frank and Dr. Hildegard Sinnock built their home at 2315 York in 1934. Mr. Sinnock was a Civil Engineer. He was the engineer for a number of harbors in Hawaii and for various railroads in the western United States. Mrs. Sinnock was a physician in Quincy, specializing in internal medicine and pediatrics. Her mother, Dr. Melinda Knapheide Germann, was one of the first female physicians in the United States. Mr. and Dr. Sinnock had two sons, Henry Germann Sinnock and Frank Aldo Sinnock. Dr. Sinnock and her brother Dr. Aldo Germann had their offices at 1231 Maine, their family home.

This home has been tastefully added on to over the years. The paneled front door and keystones over the windows are in the Georgian Revival Style. As is common in this style of home some characteristics reflect the later Adams Style, such as the outline of an elliptical fanlight over the front door and indentations in the brick over each first floor window suggest Palladian windows. The rear addition effectively doubled the square footage of the house and features an expansive kitchen, den and elevator.
