The elements of the Scott house, which represents the Queen Anne style, include a steeply pitched roof with a dominant front facing gable and a round tower or turret at the corner of the front facade. Patterned shingles in the upper gable end and a single course of patterned shingles across the front facade and turret complete the Queen Anne/Shingle style.

This wonderful home is filled with primitive antiques, authentic country crafts and collectibles which bring comfort and joy to its owners, the Zimmerman's.

While working on the restoration, the Zimmerman's discovered the old back stairway off the kitchen to the maid's quarters. The stairway had been covered by the cabinets on the lower floor and by a closet floor at the top. The stairway was replaced and opened for use.

There are many exceptional features in the house. The dramatic turret encloses the music room on the first floor and part of the master bedroom on the second floor. The master bedroom also features a working fireplace which the Zimmerman's enjoy. During restoration, the Zimmerman's discovered a "secret" room that had been closed off and forgotten. It is now the master bathroom and closet.

Although the house required a great deal of work and T.L.C., both Zimmerman's agree it was well worth the effort to restore and save their Queen Anne home.
