The fourth floor is the home of Quincy Consistory. On this floor is the office, robing room and preceptory. The preceptory has a full stage with lighting, sound system and over 70 drops. Some of these drops have been appraised at over \$100,000.00 and can not be replaced. The opera type chairs were added in about 1920. It also has a pipe organ and is used often. The wood on this floor is wild cherry.

We know little about the builder of the Temple which has had very little modification. Repair was made to the southwest corner after a tornado hit it in April 1945. We are presently in the middle of a fund raiser to replace all the windows, repair of some plaster and repair some of the metal at the top of the building.

The Temple serves over 3,000 members, both men and women by providing a meeting place for 14 related bodies. The Temple is used almost every day of the week.
