Tale of Two Houses

A pair of older homes meet different challenges for a growing Quincy household

This is a tale of two houses in Quincy's historic district, both architecturally significant and much-loved by the Wollaston family.

When Jill and Antony Wollaston moved from Florida in 2002, neither had lived in an older residence. During an open house at the Nielson home in Lawndale, they were charmed by the attention to detail and careful preservation of the 1897 Queen Anne. Jill "immediately wrote a deposit check," and the home's promise was amply fulfilled over the next few years.

During that period, the family frequently passed the Dutch Colonial structure at 1825 Jersey, and it always caught Jill's eye. Designed in 1904 by
