A part of Lots Forty-seven (47) and Forty-eight (48) in Nevin's Addition to the town, now City of Quincy, bounded and described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the intersection of the East line of Sixteenth Street with the South line of New Jersey, as now opened and established, and running thence East on said South line of Jersey Street, One Hundred Seventy-one and one-half (171 ½) feet, thence South on a line parallel with said East line of said Sixteenth Street, One Hundred Forty (140) feet to the center line of Old Jersey Street, thence West on said centerline of Old Jersey Street, One Hundred Seventy-one and One-half (171 ½) feet to said East line of said Sixteenth Street and thence North along said East line of said Sixteenth Street to the place of beginning, EXCEPTING therefrom the following described tract: commencing at a point of intersection of the East line of South Sixteenth Street and the centerline of Old Jersey, thence North on the East line of said South Sixteenth Street Twelve (12) feet, thence East parallel with the centerline of said Old Jersey Street One Hundred Twenty-nine (129) feet to the point of beginning, all situated in the County of Adams and State of Illinois, together with an easement over the East 2 feet of even width of said excepted tract, except all coal, minerals and mining rights heretofore conveyed of record, situated in the County of Adams and State of Illinois, subject to all taxes and liens of record.
