



The John and Sarah Schrage House, 1916
318 South 24th Street
Craftsman Bungalow Style

John and Sarah Schrage built their home at 318 South 24th in 1916. Mr. Schrage was a long time clerk at the Quincy Post office, located at 8th and Hampshire. He retired in 1920 after 51 years of service. Schrage was well known for his remarkable memory of addresses. Schrage was married three times. His first wife was Catherine Bullion and his second wife was Mary Eversmeyer. He married Sarah Jansen in 1913. He had no children. Schrage was very active in his church, Bethel M.E. Church at 12th and Jefferson.

The Craftsman Bungalow is a plan book variation of the "Tudor" fashion. It has a half-timbered gable with large brackets and a porch framed with stone piers and a peaked arch that give the home an Olde English flavor on the exterior. Inside the simple brick fireplace with a slab mantle carries out the Elizabethan theme.

The house has a large bedroom that connects directly to the dining room. In the rear is a small bedroom with a built in wardrobe and dresser. The space between the dining room and kitchen is a breakfast nook. Off the kitchen porch is the old milk pass through, walled off on the inside but still visible from the outside.
