This massive prairie style house was designed by George Behrensmeyer and built in 1911 by W.T. Duker. Limestone was used in the construction and the roof is tile. The massive stone arch which leads to the center roofed entry and the wraparound porch are out-

standing features. The arch is reminiscent of those frequently found in Romanesque structures throughout the country. Unusual, also, is the radical pitch of the stone surfacing on three sides of the house. Dr. and Mrs. Richard Ravel are present owners.
