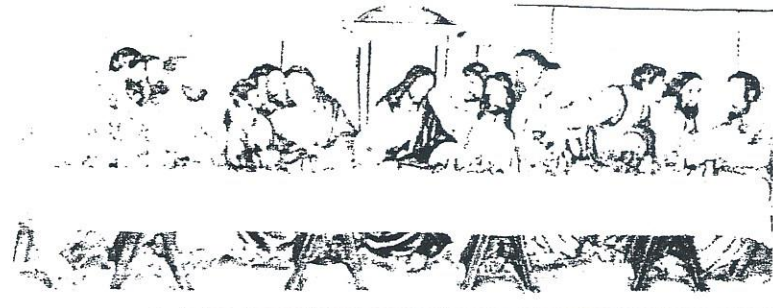
**St. Angela Merici, Virgin
Feast Day May 31**

Born on the Lake of Garda, she entered the Third Order of St. Francis and united poverty and virginity to the severest austerities to atone for the sins of the world. In consequence of a vision, she founded in 1535 a new society of holy virgins, its object being the Christian education of youth under the patronage of St. Ursula. Angela died in 1540.

**Margaret of Cortona
Feast Day – February 22**

Margaret became a mistress of Arsenio, a young nobleman and lived with him for nine years. She bore him a son who later became a Franciscan. After Arsenio was murdered, she lived a life of extreme penance and founded a hospital and a congregation of Tertiary Sisters, the Poverello, who were devoted to the care of the poor. Pope Benedict XIII canonized her on May 16, 1728.



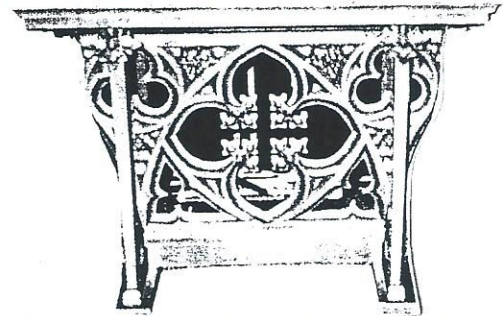
This beautiful relief setting of the Last Supper can be seen on the bottom from of the back altar. A light can be turned on to make it appear to be alive. This was added in the late 1970s.

SANCTUARY BELL is rung during the weekday masses. It is rung as the priest comes through the doorway to start the mass.

A small table used to hold vessels of the Eucharist when not on the altar. It is covered with a white cloth.
