## Dashwood House

A warm welcome awaits you as you enter this magnificent example of early 20th century Greek Revival architecture. Our home is located in the heart of Quincy's East End Historical District, part of the National Register of Historic Places. Dashwood House has been featured in the Quincy Visitors Guide, the Quincy Preserves Christmas Candlelight Tour and the Gardner Museum of Architecture and Design.

Fluted columns matching the four massive two story columns framing the front portico are repeated in several locations inside the home. A cozy fireplace and period furnishings add to the character of this grand home. A stroll up the dramatic main staircase leads to the spacious guest rooms.

The formal dining room complete with beamed ceiling, stained glass windows and sliding door provides an appropriate setting for a breakfast feast of homemade breads, pastries, cheese and fresh fruits.

History

The land on the northeast corner of 18th and Maine Streets was purchased from A. K. Harris in 1848 for \$5 by Lucius Kingman. The property was held by three different owners before being purchased by George Dashwood.

Dashwood House was designed in 1907 for George H. Dashwood by the well known Quincy architect George P. Behrensmeyer.

The house directly north of Dashwood House originally stood on the corner and was moved to its present location to make room for the new home. Dashwood House was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Schmitt in 1949, by Mary Jane Neville in 1964 and by the present owners George and Pat Bueltmann in 1994.

Advanced reservations are suggested. Reservations require a \$25 deposit, with the balance due upon arrival.


Children are welcome, but out of consideration for all guests we do not allow pets or smoking in the house.
