Wilson Hardware store evolved from former Gunther Hardware

The Gunther Hardware Co. was established in 1879 by Robert C. Gunther on Fifth between Maine and Hampshire, just north of the old Mercantile Bank.

Gunther was born in St. Louis on Oct. 31, 1851. His father died when he was five, and at 14 he had to leave school to work for the Bailey and Richardson Store in St. Louis. However, he continued his education after work and carefully saved his money. In 1870 he purchased a supply hardware goods and opened a store at 81 S. Fourth (old numbering system) in Quincy. By 1882 he had moved to 3 N. Fifth, just north Fifth and Maine. He was living at 26 Kentucky at the time.

In 1898, Gunther was at 420 Maine, but on March 1, 1899, he moved to 505 Hampshire. On July 4, 1876, he married Clara Fiebbe, who died a year later, two days after their son, Robert F. Gunther, was born. On May 5, 1881, he married his wife's sister, Anna Fiebbe. There were four children from this marriage, Agnes, Elmer, Edward and Felix.

Robert C. Gunther died in Quincy April 3, 1916. His son, Robert F. Gunther, took over the business. The son, born July 16, 1877, had entered the firm at age 16 and by 1919 was president. He married Miss Lillian Birmon of Quincy Dec. 6, 1899. There was one daughter, Geraldine, now Mrs. Clarence Quest of 2301 Ranchland. After Mrs. Gunther's death, he married her sister, Mrs. Jessie Klem.

From Quincy's Past

When he died June 17, 1961, Robert F. Gunther was the oldest member of the Rotary Club. He had helped organize the Chamber of Commerce and served as president in the late 1930s.

Robert F. Gunther purchased the building at 505 Hampshire in 1920 and put a new storefront on it. It had been owned by the D. Seger estate. He operated the business until March 26, 1943, when he announced it would close.

In 1947, J. Emmett Wilson and his son, Robert, purchased the store's stock and reopened the business. The corporation consisted of J. Emmett Wilson, Robert Wilson, Frank Kurz and Edward Bohne. J. Emmett Wilson had worked for Gunther as buyer and manager of the sporting goods department.

J. Emmett Wilson served as president of Gunther Hardware from its reopening until it closed in 1957. On Aug. 6 of that year, he and son Robert purchased the large building at 1883 Hampshire, formerly the Russell Haerle Auto Sales and garage, and moved the business — renamed Wilson Hardware — to

that location. Robert operated the hardware part of the store and his father the Pyrofax gas business. In more recent years the father specialized in lock installation and repair.

Today the company is operated by Robert Wilson, who with his wife lives at 40 Lincoln Hill N.W.

J. Emmett Wilson was born in Quincy Nov. 21, 1897, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles A. and Mary Wilson. He married Miss Helen Stewart November 24, 1920, in Quincy. He died at the age of 87 on

Sept. 24, 1985. His wife and two sons, Robert L. and Col. James E. Wilson survive.

The elder Wilson had a brilliant military career, serving in both World Wars. He began his military career in 1916, enlisting in the National Guard, and was commissioned a second lieutenant in December of that year at Camp Lee, Va. He was on active duty with the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1933.

In 1941, he was assigned to the Sixth Corps Area of Chicago and served at Fort Knox, Ky., and Fort Benning, Ga. He was commander of the Second Battalion, 45th Armored Regiment, in the 13th Armored Division and saw combat in 1944 as commander of the 715th Army Amphibious Tractor Battalion. He participated in the invasion of Saipan and Tinian. Later in 1944 he was stationed in Hawaii and was promoted to full colonel and commanding officer of the 18th Armored Group.

He left active duty in February 1946 and served as commanding officer of the training unit in Quincy. He retired in July 1956. He earned medals in both wars.

Wilson served as mayor for one term, 1931-1933. He helped organize the Tri-State Civil War Round Table and served as its president during its final year, being in charge of the Centennial parade in 1965.

have been increased recently and this branch of their business promises to be one of immense importance.

Another example of how men of progressive ideas become successful by taking advantage of a practical situation was shown when the Weems people in 1894 started their pure ice company, being pioneers in the manufacture of artificial ice in this city. This business has developed to great proportions and among the buildings they have erected is a plant including cold storage warehouse, etc. They also deal in coal. Among Mr. Weems' other interests is membership on the directing board of the Illinois State Bank.

Frank H. Weems was married June 25, 1885, to Miss Annie Lee, who is a native of Quincy, Illinois, and they have four children: Louise, who is the wife of F. Prentice Abbott, of Brooklyn, New York; Jessie, who is the wife of F. Montgomery Smith, of New York City; Charles Lee, who belongs to the United States Navy; and Frank H., who resides at Quincy. All the children were educated in the Quincy schools. Politically Mr. Weems is a republican. While vitally interested as a citizen and an active promoter of movements to add to the city's importance and also to her people's safety and comfort, he has never been willing to accept public office. He maintains fraternal relations with the Elks and the Eagles.

ROBERT FLEBBE GUNTHER. Conspicuous among the leading young hardware merchants of Quincy is Robert F. Gunther, an active and public-spirited citizen, whose influence and assistance are always sought in behalf of undertakings for the public welfare and the advancement of the best interests of the community.

His father, Robert C. Gunther, was born in St. Louis, Missouri, October 31, 1851, and died at his home in Quincy, Illinois, April 3, 1916. Coming to Quincy in 1879, he established a hardware business, putting in a line of tools and builders' supplies. Successful in his undertakings, he enlarged his stock, putting in a line of sporting goods and kitchen utensils of all kinds, and at the time of his death was carrying on an extensive business. He married first, in Carlinville, Illinois, Clara Flebbe, who was born in Macoupin County, Illinois, and was there brought up and educated. She died July 18, 1877, leaving one child, Robert Flebbe Gunther, the special subject of this sketch. He married for his second wife Miss Flebbe, a sister of his first wife, and they became the parents of four children, as follows: Elmer, deceased; Agnes, wife of Arnold V. Scott, of Quincy; Edward, deceased; and Felix, of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, connected with the Pittsburg Crucible Steel Company. The father was a man of much education, and for seven years served as a member of the school board.

At the age of sixteen years, having acquired a good education in the public schools, Robert F. Gunther entered his father's store, and under his tutelage became thoroughly acquainted with the details of the hardware business, with which he has since been actively identified. The business of which he is at the head is now owned by a stock company, with Mr. Gunther as president and treasurer, two responsible positions which he is filling most ably.

On December 6, 1899, Mr. Gunther was united in marriage with Lillian Mae Bimson, a native of Quincy, Illinois, and they have one child, Geraldine, born June 12, 1901. Mr. Gunther is a republican in politics; a member of the Quincy Rotary Club; and in religion is a Christian Scientist.

CHARLES H. LAUTER. As president of the J. B. Schott Manufacturing Company at Quincy Charles H. Lauter has given to that business, one of the largest in Quincy and one that has served to make the name Quincy significant of business enterprise all over the Middle West, the best of his own energies and abilities for thirty years. He became president eight years ago when the founder of the company died.

Mr. Lauter was born in St. Louis, Missouri, February 16, 1861, a son of the
