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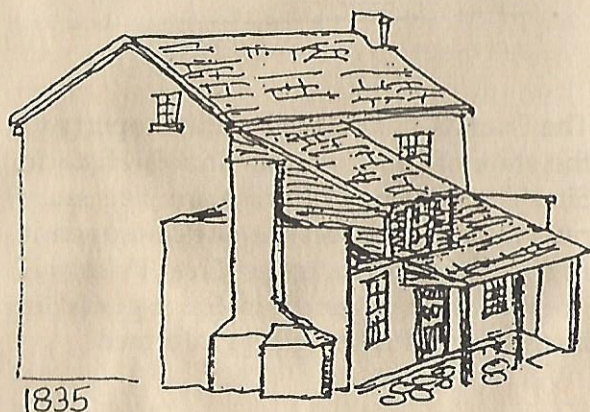
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During the last three years some stabilization and beginning restoration work has been undertaken including a year and a half professional study. An in-depth Historic Structures Report has revealing and exciting findings, including long buried features, which will assist the group in future restoration work, along with the guidance of an experienced historical architect.

The Friends' recently completed Report states in part, "The Dr. Richard Eells House is of architectural significance as an outstanding example of the transitional evolution of architecture in Quincy during the mid-19th century from Greek Revival Style of 1835 to the Italianate Style of 1873.
