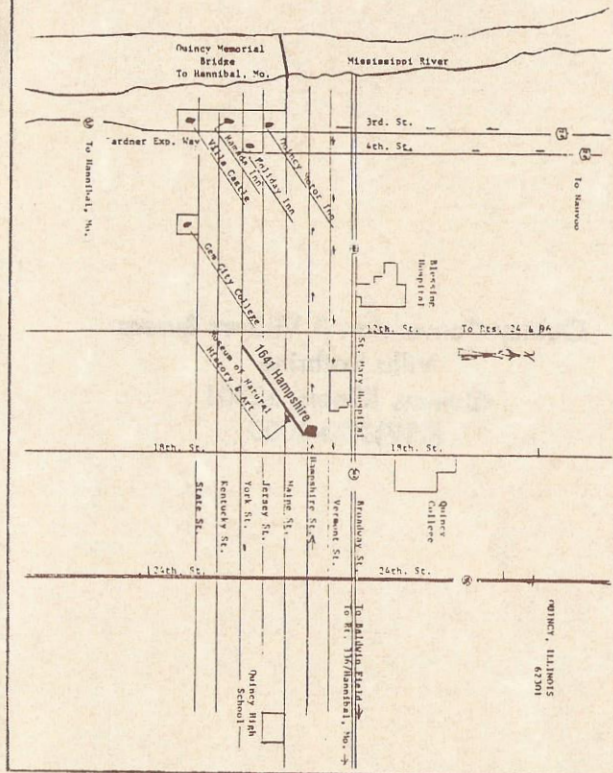
Pamper yourself and your family in the bountiful surroundings of the beautifully decorated Kaufmann House, where every room is a unique experience.

Outstanding Architectural Heritage

That's what you see as you enter the historic tree-lined streets of Quincy and peruse through the splendor of breath-taking architectural structures.

Founded in 1822 by early Illinois Governor John Wood, Quincy is nestled against the bluffs directly overlooking the vast expanse of the "mighty Mississippi". Quincy boasts of what are recognized by historians as some of the finest examples of architecture in the Midwest. Among them are a feast of styles - Greek Revival, Gothic Revival, Italianate, and Richardsonian Romanesque, exemplified in both museums and homes (open for tours).
