

HEIDBREDER HAGEMANN AND COMPANY DRUG STORE

1001 North 5th Street

This red brick building, built in 1906, has always housed this prominent Drug Store. The upper story was an apartment which was the William H. Hagemann family residence for 65 years. All three Hagemann sons were born here. Martin J. Geise designed the building which is a modified combination of several simplified architectural styles. Mr. Geise designed many other commercial buildings in the city in the same style.

The interior and exterior of the building has remained unchanged. The tin ceiling is intact and in perfect condition. Simulated graining was used for the wall show cases and were manufactured by the Quincy Show Case and Fixture Company.

This Drug Store has served the public continuously until 1984 when the Hagemanns closed the store and Ralph Hagemann retired. The retirement was brief however, for soon afterwards Mr. Hagemann decided to establish a Pharmacy Museum, which is very interesting, very unusual and the only one of its kind in Adams County.

Mr. Hagemann has done a credible job in transforming the Drug Store into a Museum. Many visitors are enjoying the environment of bygone days. At the turn of the century this was an important section of the city and prominent citizens in this area added greatly to Quincy and its growth.
