

SAMUEL COYLER HOUSE

126 South 24th Street

This simplified Queen Anne frame farm house, circa 1885-1890, was listed on the 1976 Illinois Historic Sites Survey of historic homes. At the time this house was built there were few other houses in this area of the East End of Quincy. Mr. Coyler owned a great part of the surrounding land, which he sold off in 60 by 90 plots through the years.

The house has a tin balcony on the third floor with a large arched tin landing on the second floor. Dentil trim under the cornice surrounds the entire house; a large iron Fleur de Lis symbol is on the front chimney. A leaded crystal window transom is over the living room window. The original carriage house remains at the rear of the property. The house, carriage house and (out buildings which no longer remain) were built for \$2,400.00.
