**Description:**

1. Two story brick construction
2. Exterior walls are glazed brick laid in a common bond pattern with wood trim, stone string courses and brick string courses
3. Main and rear elevations both have porches
4. Two chimneys with decorative stepped brick
5. Wide fascia and overhanging eave at the roof line reinforces the horizontal as well as the front porch
6. Porch extends the entire length of the facade with a solid brick balustrade and massive piers and columns
7. Brick and stone string courses on the wall surfaces also reinforce the horizontality
8. Window treatments are simple; facade appears symmetrical
9. Entry with leaded glass sidelights and toplights makes the opening as wide as the window to its left, another device to stress the horizontal line
10. Canopy sheltering the side entry of the north elevation strengthens the horizontal by using chain supports instead of a complex roof form

**History:**

William H. Heidbreder and his wife, Anna, resided in this home and in 1916 he is listed in the city directory as the secretary and manager of Gem City Stove Company.
