ST. BARTHOLOMEW

**He had a gift of faith and saw Jesus as
the son of God and King of Israel.**

ST. THOMAS

**His grief for Jesus was so great, he could
not believe until he saw the wounds
himself.**

ST. PETER

**God honored him with the
leadership of the whole church.**

ST. ANDREW

**A friend of St. John and a brother of
St. Peter.**

ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST

**He was so loved by Jesus that he
was to replace Jesus to Mary.**

ST. MATTHEW

**He writes in the Gospel about Jesus
being our longed-for Messiah who
fulfilled the Prophet and founded a
Church of the New Covenant.**

**St. Dominic, Confessor
Feast Day, August 4th**

**A native of Calaroga in old
Castile, Spain. He was a member
of the illustrious house of
Guzman. Born in 1170, he
founded the Order of Preachers,
propagated devotions to the
Rosary, and saved the Western
church from the growing power
of the Albigensian heresy. He led
an extremely active life preaching
the Gospel, lecturing in theology
and establishing houses of his
order. He died at Bologna, Italy
at age 51.**

**St. Leonard, Confessor
Feast Day, Nov. 26**

**Born Dec. 20, 1676. At 13 years
old he was sent to Rome to
study. He entered the
Franciscan's order. He studied
philosophy. After ordination he
was appointed professor but
became very ill and sought the
Blessed Virgin's help to get back
his health. In return he would
become a Missionary. His health
restored and he spent 40 years
preaching in Tuscany, Corsica and
Italy. He always moved the
crowds that came to hear him.
He died at the age of 75.**
