The painting on the south wall depicts St. Francis telling that Lady of Poverty is his "Espousal" (bride).

**St. Anthony, Confessor
Feast Day - June 13**

One of the greatest Franciscan Saints. He is called upon by many for help with their problems. Supernatural forces seemed to be at his command. (Note: St. Anthony offering the lily of purity to Little Jesus)

Our Main Altar that is used today was constructed by Alan Fischer (one of the talented men of the parish). Alan used material from the communion rail.

On the north side you will see the Sorrowful Mother's Altar. This came from the First St. Francis Church. The statue was given to the church by Mrs. John (Maria) Blickhan. She earned the money from selling her home-made horseradish. I learned this information because she was my great great grandmother.

THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS

BAPTISM is the door to life and to the kingdom of God.

CONFIRMATION is for those who have been baptized and continue on the path of Christian initiation through the sacrament of confirmation.

PENANCE This sacrament is one of reconciliation for those who have disrupted their friendship with God.

HOLY EUCHARIST Believing in Jesus Christ, we desire to receive Him

MATRIMONY is an intimate union by which each partner freely bestows on and accepts from the other a life-long commitment.

HOLY ORDERS is a sacrament for men to become priests. They are consecrated to preach the Gospel, shepherd the faithful and to celebrate divine worship for all.

EXTREME UNCTION This was known as the last sacrament and was given to those close to death. Today it is known as the healing sacrament.
