1. Overall one and one-half (1 1/2) storey massing with a primary hip roof and secondary gable roofs
2. Cut limestone foundation walls and brick exterior walls
3. Chimney on the East facade with decorative brickwork, and tall chimney on the West facade
4. All window and door openings with segmental brick arches or stone lintels, stone sills, wood framework, glazing, and original doors
5. One-storey porches on the East and South Facades (three in all), with wooden posts, rail, balustrade, brackets, and all carving associated
6. Decorative features such as:
 - a. iron balustrade on main roof and bay roof
 - b. wooden barge board in gables
 - c. wooden cornice at the roofline
 - d. dormer on North Facade with a gable roof
 - e. all wood carvings
 - f. Palladian window configurations under segmental brick arched openings in the gables of the South and East facades
