Queen Anne Style • 1898

The yellow brick house at 2051 Maine was built by William and Lizetta Fick in 1898. Fick was the half owner of Fick Coal Company and his wife was the daughter of Albert Dick of Dick Brothers Brewery.

The exterior features thin yellow bricks and mortar made of very fine sand. The front porch has 19 pillars. Wide belt courses with dentils decorate the second and third stories of the house. The house has two three story bay areas. The windows are decorated with dentils, festoons and carved panels.

The west side of the house features the porte cochere. There is a bracketed oriel window and a gothic side door.

The foyer of the home is encased in oak paneling and crown molding. The fireplace has a beautifully carved mantel and golden brown ceramic surround. The brass mantel sconces are original to the home. The ceiling is beamed with carved rosettes. The room is dominated by the massive staircase. The large newel post has ornamentation that is seen in the dining room and throughout the house.

The front parlor woodwork is cherry. it has double pocket doors and the oak mantel features glazed tile in light yellow. The back parlor is an exotic wood that hasn't been identified, possibly light mahogany. The windows in this room, the library and the attic have curved glass. The library features a fireplace surrounded by large built-in oak and beveled glass bookcases.

The dining room of the house is one of the few if no the only wood paneled oval dining rooms in the city. The room also includes a buffet built into the oval room, plus the room's curved door and header molding.

The butler's pantry and kitchen are in the rear of the house. The kitchen has a warming oven built into the radiator.

The second floor bedrooms of the home are as grand as the first floor. Beautiful woodwork continues upstairs. Two of the bedrooms are suites with bay windows. The master suite features an elaborate fireplace. One of the bathrooms features a clawfoot tub and marble sink.
