

HISTORY OF PROPERTY AT 1020 Kentucky

Aug. 31, 1847 Property belonging to John Wood surveyed and laid off into blocks, lots, and streets.

1856 - 1918 Many transactions of real estate took place for the two and one half lots.

 Jacob and Margaret Dick lived in a house on the eastern part of the lots which today is just yard and a driveway. (We have a picture of that original home.)

 Their son August Dick made several transactions to buy the property.

Aug. 25, 1917 Blueprint of the present home by George P. Behrensmeyer.

 August (Manny) Dick, a bachelor, tore down the original home and built the present home on the western part of the property for himself and his mother. That lot should have been 1018 Kentucky, but since Manny was used to his mail saying 1020 Kentucky they did not change the address.

Aug. 14, 1943 August (Manny) Dick died.

May 19, 1944 The home and extra lot was purchased by John and Mary Margaret (Mamie) Duker, owners of the Duker Funeral home.

June 7, 1969 John Duker died.

Dec. 12, 1970 Mrs. Duker died.
