- o The Baldwin-Dayton-Emery House
- o Current owners purchased house in November 2003; moved in from Ocean City, Maryland in May 2004 and from Baltimore, Maryland on September 8, 2004
- o Built in 1880 by Ebenezer G. and Agnes W. Baldwin
- o Queen Anne with Eastlake, Gothic, and Classical elements (transitional architecture between Italianate and Queen Anne)
- o Wrap-around porch added 1901
- o Porch ceiling fan, Emerson, 1900
- o Summer kitchen removed in 1990s (replaced 2006-07)
- o First floor woodwork walnut
- o Second floor woodwork butternut
- o Floors oak, with walnut in music room; maple in south bedroom

### Vestibule

- o Walnut double doors (pair)
- o Original stained glass transom
- o Diamond parquet in oak floor
- o Walnut bead board surround (walls and ceiling)
- o Original etched glass interior doors

### **Entrance Hall**

- o Walnut beamed ceiling
- o Alternating red, white, and dark oak flooring

- o Device to summon servants to a specific room (brought from Baltimore)

- o Pine quilt box, circa 1931 (Oklahoma)
- o Oak dining set, pedestal table (circa 1900); chairs (circa 1890)
- o Victorian pine corner cupboard, circa 1880 (Pennsylvania); Stahgl ("Golden Harvest") breakfast set, circa 1950, and Fostoria ("Jamestown") stem ware
